APPLICATION FOR FDIME 'INTERNAL MEDICINE RESEARCH GRANT'

The Internal Medicine Research Grant funding is intended for research projects dedicated to polymorbidity and other common conditions in Internal Medicine.

Up to 20,000 Euros is available, to be awarded for a maximum study period of 1 year.

The objective of the grant awards is to promote exchanges between European researchers enabling the grant recipient to undertake research.

The purpose of the grant is to provide part-funding to facilitate the applicant's living expenses during the period of research, and not for organizing the research itself.

A budget plan for living expenses must be submitted with your application.

The applicant is required to inform FDIME of any additional sources of funding that have been applied for, or are available to them for the intended research project.

1. Eligibility criteria

- The Applicant must be a Young Internist, and under the age of 38 years.
- The Applicant must be a member of one of the National Societies of Internal Medicine affiliated to EFIM (the European Federation of Internal Medicine), and have been a member for not less than 1 year at the time of application.
- The Applicant must be able to submit a relevant Project Proposal. The project can cover translational medicine, basic or clinical research.
- The Applicant must provide proof of eligibility (copy of passport or birth certificate and your National Society membership number or letter of support from your Society)

vi)	A letter from the Chief of Laboratory or Department of Medicine, Certifying that the project will be carried out in their laboratory/ clinical department; including the date when the period of research will be undertaken. (Projects to start after 30 September 2017)	
vii)	Budget plan: Estimated monthly living costs/expenses in the host country.	

Note: For clinical research projects and research on animal models, the opinion of an Ethics Committee should be obtained.

Additional Information

i) The applicant is responsible for identifying the Institution/Project where the research will be undertaken.

ii) At the end of the period of research, the applicant is required to submit an article (review or original article) for publication in the European Journal of Internal Medicine (EJIM) to report on at least a part of the research that has been undertaken. The grant provided by the FDIME must be included in an Acknowledgement at the end of the article.

iii) The Research Grant Selection Board will assess all applications and will inform successful candidates. The decision is of the Research Grant Selection Board is irrevocable and non-negotiable.
